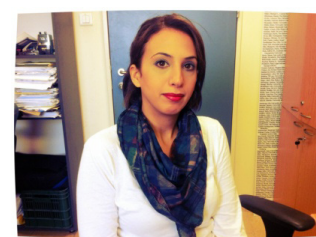
From January 12 - 14, 2014, the Bucerius Institute is hosting the conference “**International Affairs and the Politics of Memory: German-Jewish-Israeli Relations after the Holocaust**”. The conference is organized in cooperation with **Dr. Jacob S. Eder** (Jena) and **Hubert Leber, M.A.** (Mainz). It will be dedicated to **Prof. Dres. h.c. Manfred Lahnstein**. Across five thematic panels, scholars from Germany, Israel, Great Britain and the USA will present their research on a variety of aspects of German-Jewish-Israeli relations since 1945. **Prof. Dan Diner** will hold the opening lecture.
