On **May 1, 2014** **Dr. Anne Maximiliane Jäger-Gogoll** from the Philipps University Marburg, will give a lecture on the topic “**Schwierige Heimkehr. Ateş was born in Istanbul and specialized on criminal and family law. She has a highly critical view of the immigrant Muslim society that is in her perspective often more conservative than its Turkish counterpart. The event will take place at **18:00** at the Library Auditorium of the University of Haifa.

On **May 22, 2014** the Bucerius Institute welcomes **Prof. Malachi Hacoheh** from the Duke University. His lecture “**The Austrian Empire and Jewish European History**” will reflect on the plurality of Jewish cultures in Europe putting an emphasis on the diversity of both modernist and traditional discourses. The event will take place at **18:00** at the University of Haifa.
